Eucharistic Processions Attract Thousands

Previous editions of this column have included photos of mid-20th century Eucharistic Congresses and Processions. Accompanying text lamented that we may never see the likes of these thousands of Catholics supporting such events ever again. Little did we know that 2024 has proven us wrong: There have been several events across the globe which have attracted crowds frankly unthinkable as little as one year ago.

The internet has been rife with photos of the recent Eucharistic Procession in the Archdiocese of St. Paul-Minneapolis, Minnesota, which saw the participation of approximately 7,000 faithful. This past week, Sachin Jose, whose account on X is dedicated to showcasing good news from around the Catholic world, featured photos of a Eucharistic Procession in Sydney, Australia which saw an incredible 15,000 participants [photos below taken from videos he posted on X]. And yes, regular readers will be pleased to learn that the Sydney diocesan youth choir, also recently featured in this column, sang Gregorian Chant to accompany the procession. Though smaller in scale, it's also noteworthy that an increasing number of parishes worldwide are holding Eucharistic Processions on the Feast of Corpus Christi, locally including St. Aloysius, Detroit and St. Priscilla, Livonia.

Daily Mass: 7:00 AM, 7:30 AM, 8:00 AM
