The Blessing of Sacred Images



While the Traditional Roman Ritual contains some specialized blessings for specific religious articles (e.g.: the Miraculous Medal, Rosary, Brown Scapular, and St. Benedict Medal), there is also a catch-all blessing of Sacred Images which is to be used for any religious image for which there is no specific blessing. This prayer can be used with pictures, medals, rings, statues, and other items depicting one of the types of religious images listed as an option.

If you ever see a priest pause during a blessing and try to figure out what words he is to pray next, he is likely trying to determine which of the options in this prayer is appropriate for the type(s) of objects he is blessing.

As with all of the blessings in the Traditional Ritual, the 1962 rubrics require that these are only to be prayed in Latin. The English translation is only provided for reference.

Thine Apostle, (or Martyr), (or Pontiff), (or Confessor), (or Virgin). And grant that whosoever through the inspiration of this image earnestly strives to honor and worship Him (or the Blessed Virgin, or the glorious Apostle, or Martyr, or Pontiff, or Confessor, or Virgin), may by His (his or her) merits obtain grace in this life and eternal glory in the next. Through (the same) Christ our Lord.
